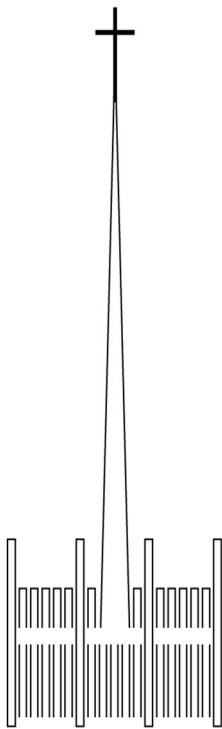

Choral services have always been a central part of this offering, as we aim to provide the highest quality of music to complement the liturgy.
