**COMPLINE:** The Gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir will be singing 'Compline by Candlelight' throughout Lent. This atmospheric service will take place on most Fridays in Lent, starting on 23<sup>rd</sup> February. Please check the Music List or bulletin for more information each week.

**LENT ORGAN MUSIC:** The Cathedral Organists will play works by the Belgian composer César Franck before and after the services of Choral Evensong on Sundays 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of March. The closing voluntaries will be the substantial 'Chorals', commencing with the much-celebrated Choral No. 3 in A minor. Before the service, the music will be drawn from the 'Six Pieces'; to hear them, please seated by 3.45pm each Sunday to hear this superb music in preparation for worship.

**LUNCHTIME RECITAL:** The next lunchtime recital is at 1.00pm on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> February will be given by Adrian Lord (*piano*). All are welcome – admission is free, but donations are requested.

**THE CATHEDRAL EUCHARIST:** From the beginning of Lent the said parts of the service will follow Common Worship Order One. This means that the said parts of the service will no longer be 'thee and thou' language. This does not affect the choral parts of the service which will still use traditional and Latin settings to be sung by the choir. In addition we have decided to retain the traditional Merbecke congregational setting of the Creed. This change will bring us into line with other cathedrals and enable people who join us as visitors to 'recognise' the liturgy as one they use in their own churches.

**GIFT SHOP BOOK OF THE MONTH:** 'The Pillars of the Earth' is a detailed history of the building of a cathedral in the 12th Century, at a time of turmoil in England. There is a civil war in progress between Stephen and Maud, and civil unrest on a smaller scale in the resistance of the peasants to the oppressive rule of the barons, as well as insight into the monastic life. Although lengthy, the book holds the attention at all times and will make any reader a fan of Ken Follett. Recommended by Jeremy Duerden, we have copies for sale in the shop at £9.99.
