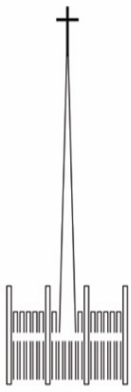
**BLACKBURN FOODBANK:** are currently short of warm winter clothes including coats/jackets for children (aged 5-13) and men. Thank you for your continued support.
