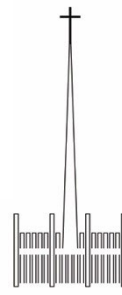

“Let the little children come to me, for of such is the kingdom of heaven”

It was an inspirational idea by our Sunday School leaders to invite us after Christmas to ‘drop in’ to see what they do, and to receive a small gift.

As I stood with others just outside the Chesters Room, looking on, I thought of myself as both an artist (which I am definitely not) and a grandparent (which I definitely am).

What would have found its way on to the canvas was a group of children with white and black faces reading lines from the Gospel of the day; siblings, parents and others through the whole age range being really impressed; then (and maybe this would have required a second picture) everyone mingling cheerfully together as the goodies were handed around.

What was going through my mind as a grandparent was how children feel about faith.

Although there are only two of us, the rest of our family are in multiples of five: five children, five spouses, ten grandchildren, with five of either sex. If you take away the age of the youngest, who is one, from the oldest, who is twenty one, even the answer is a multiple of five.

These youngsters make an interesting focus group. (Please don’t tell them I said that).

A big question for us is how does the Cathedral relate to young people such as these?

They are busy at school and college, gifted in one way or another, tech savvy, some fanatical about football, some anxious about their body image and afraid of seeming odd, others wondering about exams and their future careers. Many of the older ones have a strong commitment to racial tolerance and equality of the sexes and want to do what they can to combat poverty and climate change.

I hear that in Birmingham, the staff of the Diocese includes the post of ‘Director of Getting Younger’. Since the average age of the city’s population is twenty-five whereas the figure for church people is sixty five, the role must be to try to ‘bridge the gap’ –

Visit My Mosque Day - 3rd March 2019

'Visit My Mosque' day is a national initiative facilitated by the Muslim Council of Britain encouraging 200 mosques across the UK to hold open days to welcome in their neighbours from all faiths and none and help build bridges across communities.

Whilst mosque open days in Britain have been taking place for decades, 'Visit My Mosque' allows mosques to be a part of a nationwide event where mosques are able to open their door together on the same day. The initiative was first conceived in February 2015 with about 20 mosques taking part. Now, due to popular demand the initiative has grown to over 200 mosques taking part,

The English Cathedral

Following on from its acquisition by the V&A's permanent photography collection, Blackburn Cathedral is proud to be the first venue to exhibit 'The English Cathedral' by Peter Marlow as it begins a tour of the country.

42 photographs representing all 42 cathedrals of the Church of England by Magnum photographer Peter Marlow (1952 - 2016) will be on display in the South Transept from 1st February until 1st of March 2019.

In 2008, Marlow was commissioned by Royal Mail, on the occasion of the 300th anniversary of the completion of St Paul's Cathedral, to photograph six cathedrals. The resulting images of Lichfield, Belfast, Gloucester, St David's, Westminster, and St Magnus in Orkney were issued as a set of six commemorative stamps and a miniature sheet.

Once the commission was complete, Marlow was inspired to continue the project and in the following four years shot all 42 of the cathedrals of the Church of England.

Each cathedral was photographed at dawn using only natural light. This endeavour can be viewed as a contemporary update to tradition of church photography in England, particularly the work of Frederick Evans and Edwin Smith. Marlow's photographic typology of England's Anglican cathedrals was published in a monograph by Merrell in 2012.
