

**GORDON POLLOCK:** It is sad news that Gordon Pollock, known to many at the Cathedral, died last week. Gordon's funeral will take place on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March at the Cathedral, 10.30 am.

**PEAL BOARD:** As part of the Nation's Tribute for 100 years of Remembrance since the end of the First World War a Peal was rung on the Cathedral Bells in October to Remember Five Ringers from Blackburn who gave their lives and whose names are proudly recorded on the stone memorial in the Cathedral Ringing Room.

The Dean and Chapter have commissioned a Peal Board of that Peal which is being displayed at the West End of the Cathedral for viewing by Congregation and visitors before being installed in the ringing Room.
