ARMISTICE SERVICES AND COMMEMORATIONS

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY: Please see the reverse for details of the Cathedral services on 11th November, Remembrance Sunday. Additional commemorations:

6.00am A lone piper will mark the Centenary of the signing of the WWI Armistice documents outside the Cathedral.

6.40pm-8.00pm, *Battle's Over – A Nation's Tribute*. A short commemoration of the centenary of the end of the First World War. This service will include at **7.00pm** the lighting of a *Beacon of Light* and at **7.05pm** *Ring out for Peace* when our bell ringers will join with churches and cathedrals across the nation in a cry for peace across the world.

“Brothers in Arms”: Thursday 8th November, 7.30pm. This play is the true story of twin brothers, Noel and Christopher Chavasse, who served with great courage during the First World War. Their father was the Right Reverend Francis James Chavasse, Bishop of Liverpool. The play, which has recently been performed at the Edinburgh Fringe, celebrates their service, bravery and deep rooted Christian faith. Tickets, priced £2, are on sale from the Cathedral Shop. Proceeds will be donated to the British Legion.

This commemorative concert, joined by Blackburn with Darwen Brass Band, is marking the 100th Anniversary of the Armistice.
