### **Evensong Introit Words:**

If I take the wings of morning and remain in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there also shall thy hand lead me, and thy right hand shall uphold me.

### **Evensong Anthem Words:**

They that go down to the sea in ships; and occupy their business in great waters; these men see the works of the Lord and his wonders. For at his word, the stormy wind ariseth, which lifteth up the waves thereof. They are carried up to the heav'n and down again to the deep: their soul melteth away because of the trouble. They reel to and fro and stagger like a drunken man, and are at their wits' end. So they cry to the Lord in their trouble: he delivereth them out of their distress. For he maketh the storm to cease, so that the waves thereof are still. Then they are glad because they are at rest: and so he bringeth them unto the haven where they would be.
